

Quorum Presidency Responsibilities 2019

Aaronic Priesthood quorum presidents are given the keys to administer the affairs of the quorums over which they preside. They are the acting, directing heads of the quorums. They are assisted in these responsibilities by their counselors (or assistants), the quorum secretary, the quorum advisor(s), and the bishopric.

Their main responsibilities are:

Preside Over The Quorum:

1. Observe the counsel and instruction of the bishopric.
2. Report regularly on the condition and progress of the quorum and each quorum member.
3. Seek the counsel of the quorum advisor(s).
4. Organize and supervise the quorum activities, providing each quorum member with opportunities for Priesthood assignments, for leadership experiences, and for spiritual growth.
5. Develop love, brotherhood and loyalty among quorum members.
6. Prayerfully seek the direction of the Spirit in administering the quorum.
7. Attend quorum presidency meeting, quorum meeting, quorum activities, Mutual, Bishop's Youth Committee (BYC) meeting, temple trips, and other YM/YW events.

Teach Quorum Members Their Duties:

1. Teach duties as given in D&C 20:46-59; 107:85-87.
2. Welcome and orient new quorum members.

Watch Over Each Quorum Member:

1. Observe and council with quorum members in order to determine what they are interested in, their challenges, and how to help them grow and develop.
2. Visit in their homes, fellowship, and minister to quorum members that are struggling, less active, unordained, and have special needs.

Provide Quality, Unifying Activities With A Purpose:

Plan and execute quality activities with a Priesthood purpose that will have a meaningful outcome, build strong relationships with each other, leaders, and families, and promote quorum unity and brotherhood. Follow all church safety and other policies and guidelines.

1. **Weekly** – plan and carry out weekly activities that provide a well-balanced program within each quorum’s area(s) of focus:

- **Teacher & Priest (ages 14-18):**

- service
- spiritual development
- social experiences with YW and others
- physical fitness
- intellectual growth
- vocational/career investigation
- self-reliance
- citizenship
- 2 to 3 overnight activities annually are encouraged
- register, support and encourage young men ages 14 and older who desire to earn the Scouting rank of Eagle Scout until 2020. Do Scouting activities on a different night of the week.
